



## TRANSFER PATHWAY GUIDE

### Associate in Applied Science in Business Administration Accounting Track to Bachelor of Science in Accounting

#### **Overview**

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for Associate in Applied Science in Business Administration Accounting Track at the Kentucky Community and Technical College System and leads to the Bachelor of Science in Accounting at Franklin University.

#### **Degree Requirements**

1. The Franklin University Bachelor of Science in Business Administration requires completion of 124 semester hours, with 30 hours of the coursework completed at Franklin.
2. With this pathway, the student can complete up to 94 credits at KCTCS and the remaining 30 credits with Franklin University.
3. To be awarded an undergraduate degree:
  - All students must attain a minimum Franklin University cumulative GPA of 2.00
  - All students must attain a minimum GPA of 2.25 in the major area, and each major area course be completed with a grade of "C" or better to count toward degree requirements

#### **General Transfer Requirements**

Application process: Complete Franklin University's free online [application](#). After applying – students should submit official transcripts from all colleges attended. The admissions process can take 4-6 weeks from application receipt to registration depending on how quickly official transcripts arrive. Franklin University uses a rolling admissions process - which allows students to apply for admission at any time throughout the year. Once receipt of transcripts - please allow up to 3 weeks for acceptance, review and preparation of an official program evaluation, and registration for courses. If a student does not transfer English or Algebra credit – placement tests may be required. An Admissions Counselor at Franklin University will notify the student if a placement test is required and the options to take the test or waive the test (if taking the equivalencies at their community college). Students will register for their first semester with their Franklin University Enrollment Advisor and assigned an Academic Advisor for future term registrations.

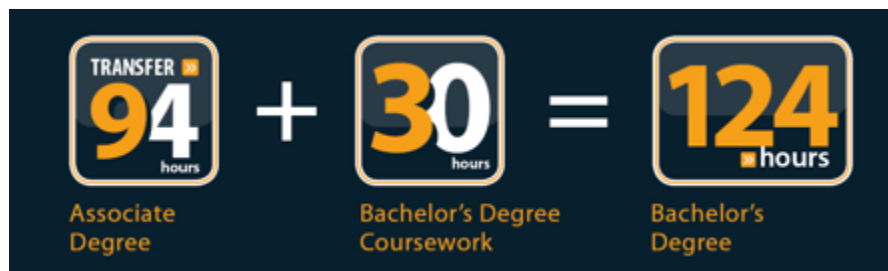
Financial aid: If a student is considering using Financial Aid to help pay for their education – students must complete the FAFSA for the academic year of attendance and include the Franklin University school code 003046. Students should consult their Franklin University Enrollment Advisor if they are unsure as to what FAFSA applies to their intended dates of attendance.

Scholarships: Franklin University offers several scholarships (Merit-based, Community Service, and STEM). You can view specific details about our scholarship by visiting [scholarships](#). Franklin University requires a 3.0 GPA and a 500-word personal essay. Our scholarship deadline dates are as follows:

Summer – April 1<sup>st</sup>, Fall – July 1, and Spring – November 1<sup>st</sup>. Scholarship awards range from \$500 to \$2,000 (based on hours enrolled at Franklin University). Students will be required to submit their Undergraduate Scholarship Application and essay before the application deadline. Some scholarships require more than one essay.
